Good social skills allow kids to enjoy better peer relationships. But the benefits of robust social skills reach far beyond social acceptance. Children with better social skills are likely to reap immediate benefits. For example, one study found that good social skills may reduce stress in children who are in daycare settings.

7 Most Important Social Skills for Kids

Model social interaction, turn taking and reciprocity. Teach imitation, motor as well as verbal. Teach context clues and referencing those around you (for example, 'if everyone else is standing, you should be too!'). Break social skills into small component parts, and teach these skills through supported interactions.

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
